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Greece's energy consumption is characterized by a diverse mix of sources, with petroleum products being the largest contributor, accounting for 52.4% of the energy supply as of 2021.

As of 2022, electricity generation in Greece stood at 53 terawatt hours of electricity, making the country rank 15th in electricity ...

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Primary energy consumption rebounded to 19.8 Mtoe, with oil leading at 52%. Electricity generation increased by 11%, driven by renewables and gas, while lignite's share dropped to 6%. Greece aims ...

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
